




Blue Down South: A Story of the Loyal Germans of the Texas Hill Country During the Civil War

A Story of the Loyal Germans of the Texas Hill Country During the Civil War The town of Fredericksburg, located in the Texas Hill Country near the center of the State, was settled by the German Immigration Society in 1846. The town was a hundred miles past the frontier so the Germans made their own peace treaty with the Camanche Indians who were at war with the Texas at that time. During the next fifteen years German settlers continued to arrive, spreading out to cover a large part of the surrounding country. They learned to farm local crops that suited the local soil and learned to be stockmen as well. In general they prospered. In 1861 the Germans watched Texas succeed from the Union and join the Confederacy with a great deal of dismay. They, like the rest of the frontier settlements, depended on the U.S. Army for protection from the Indians and Mexican bandits. The U.S. Army was rounded up by the Confederates and shipped north by boat leaving many of the frontier forts abandoned. None of...
